The keynote addresses will be delivered by specialists on thromboprophylaxis and thrombophilias.

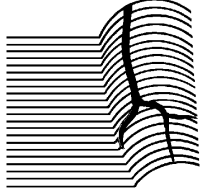

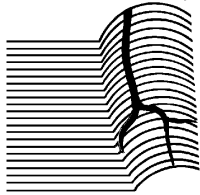
