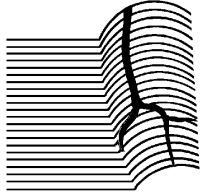

Endovenous chemical ablation with short catheter technique
Safety elements
Proximal sclerosis
Elevation of the limb
Injection of appropriate filling volume
Knowledge of limitation of compression
Closed gate manoeuvres
Local finger compression (leg ulcers)
Nitrogen free microfoam
Low concentration of POL (0,2-1%)
